M.G. 18/80 Hub Studs – from Keith Herkes

When was the last time you checked the hub studs on your M.G. 18/80? Considering the amount of rotational force they have to endure, they are prime candidates to self-destruct if the six outer nuts are not kept tight.

It has recently come to light during the re-commissioning of a Mk I 18/80, that has not been used for a couple of years, that the "wear and tear" of the rear hub studs has almost reached the point of a catastrophic failure.

A similar occurrence was highlighted in News Update No.12 November 2020, when I reported that studs had actually sheared.

The usual reasons for the studs to be replaced are: stretched or damaged threads, broken stud or they have become loose thus making it difficult to undo or tighten up. For the latter, a temporary measure is to cut a slot in the outer end and hold it with a screwdriver whilst tightening the nut.

I still have a few re-manufactured Mk I studs left from the batch I had made last year, so should you wish to tackle the replacement of your Mk I rear studs, or be prepared for a future need, these are available in sets of six. (one side only) at a cost of £21.00 plus £2.00 UK postage. Contact <u>keith.herkes@btinternet.com</u> or 01234 771769.

I would also suggest that the nuts and spring washers are replaced at the same time. (3/8 B.S.F.)

SOME NEWS FOR TRAVELLERS TO EUROPE

Green Cards no longer required for UK drivers

Following the UK's departure from the EU, all UK motorists have been required to hold a Green Card as proof of insurance cover when driving in the European Economic Area (EEA) since 1st January 2021.

This has now changed as the European Union has confirmed that drivers of UK-registered vehicles will no longer need a Green Card to take their vehicle to EU countries.

Previously, all UK-registered vehicles were legally required to carry a Green Card, but under the new changes, the UK will be admitted into the Green Card Free Circulation Zone. This means UK motorists will be able to travel to EU countries freely without requiring additional insurance documents.

Since 2nd August, UK motorists travelling to the EU or EEA area no longer need to hold a Green Card, though we recommend still requesting a Green Card from your insurer or broker until September to ensure the member countries are aware of the rules.
